

Your vehicles differential is the final component of what's normally called "the running gear". Getting power to the ground begins with the engine, which transmits its motion to the transmission which in turn transfers it to the drive shaft which passes it onto the differential.

DIFFERENTIALSFALL INTO ONE OF FOUR DISTINCT CATEGORIES


- **1. OPEN** This is the most common type, which you'll find it used in most "everyday" vehicles. This differential allows each wheel to rotate at a different speed during turns and for one wheel to spin if it's on a slippery surface.
- **2. LIMITED SLIP** This differential is found on most sports/high performance cars including track cars. It allows for equal "drive" pressure to both wheels, even if one is on a slippery surface but still allows for different wheel speeds on turns.
- **3. LOCKING** This differential is commonly found on 4 wheel drive and off-road vehicles. Its action can be controlled by the driver.
- **4. Spools —** Most commonly used in drag cars. It does not allow for any slippage at any time.

The differential has three primary functions:

- 1. It directs power to the axles, wheels and tires.
- It acts as the final gear reduction.By changing differential gears, you can control how many RPMs your engine will be at in any given gear.
- **3.** It transfers power to the wheels while allowing for different wheel speeds during turns (hence the name differential).

A common question is "Why can't the wheels always turn at the same speed?" That's a good question.

Let's take a look at the potential problems it would cause. Because each wheel follows a path of a different diameter during turns (see Illustration A), the outside wheel on the longer path, will rotate faster to keep up with the inside wheel.



If the wheels are locked together and not allowed to rotate independently, one or both of them will begin binding and then hopping on the pavement. Due to the forces applied to drivetrain components during such binding, items such as axles and drive gears located inside the differential can be badly damaged. It's because of these forces and the resulting damage that differentials were created. Let's take a look at a typical open differential (See Illustration B) and see how it works.

With power applied, the driveshaft turns the pinion gear which in turn, turns the ring gear. The ring gear is attached to a carrier housing which contains a planetary gear set. This gear set is made up of two spyder or planetary gears and two side or sun gears. The spyder gears are attached to the carrier by way of a large shaft and can spin freely before the side gears are installed.

The side gears are attached to the axles but not to the housing. Because of this, as one wheels speeds up the other wheel slows down at the same rate. This is what creates the ability for the different wheel speed from the axle as you turn a corner. Clear as mud, right? This set-up is also what creates the ability for one wheel to spin freely from the other if on a slippery surface or as you apply power during a turn. So how do we overcome that?

The answer: the Limited Slip Differential. But that's a whole new subject that we can cover next month.

Now that's its March, we can all start thinking about getting our cars out of the garage. You may want to review our column "Think Spring! It's Almost That Time" published in the March 2012 issue of Über Alles.
