

MEMBERSHIP reported a new member, bringing our total to 90 members. He is Doug Dykstra. Jan also indicated that she was running out of cards, and was instructed to go ahead and order more.

TREASURER reported a checking account balance of \$509.06, and a savings account balance of \$1035.39.

IROC Report: times from Grattan will be posted in the July UBER ALLES.

UBER ALLES reported that due to decreased printing costs, we will probably break even on the year. The deadline is still the board meeting each month. We will probably see more photos now.

GRATTAN MIDWEEK: was a break even event. Earlier planning and better publicity is needed for next year.

A look around at coming events in the Western Michigan area reveals that the other sports car clubs are plenty busy.



What else can you say? If you missed it, you can get a little taste of what you missed by showing up at the IROC autocross and party in September. Hope to see you there.





Two thirds of the IROC series is done. The joint event sponsored by WMR, MIR, and MSR took place June 27 and 28, and the weather cooperated (except for a few moments on Sunday) very well, thank you.

The turnout was not overwhelming, but that meant more track time for those who did show up. There were definitely no complaints in that department.

Everyone who ran was scheduled to work in some capacity, and most of the time things went very smoothly.

WMR had 17 entries out of 46, and that should help a little in keeping the overall IROC championship this year. But it's still going to be decided at the last event of the series at Ionia. That's our home event, and the kind of support that we saw last year will certainly help in hanging onto the championship. (Last year WMR brought out over 30 drivers! Very impressive.)

As far as the results of the event go, you can see that WMR took home its share of the hardware, including Ladies FTD going to Nancy Dunn for the second time this year. (She took it home from the Road America IROC earlier this year.)

Other than that, there isn't much to say...except we'll see you at Ionia. We really need your support at this one.

In the results, the underlined time is the fastest time. Also, because there were many classes that didn't have enough cars to make a class (it takes 3), there were a number of classes that were combined. However, this was only for the day's event. For overall IROC points, cars will be given first place points for the class in which they belong, even though they were bumped higher for the day.


