Driver's Schools - Next month at Grattan we will be having a driver's school. 
Two weeks later, Sue Andrews won the same class while Nancy Dunn finished second, driving a car with a stinky, smoking, destroyed clutch.

- A: Rusty, I'd go out and have my body painted brown to match the rust. That way it won't show up so bad.


