





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# PRODUCTION DEPARTMENT QUOTATIONS CHUCK OLENYK

<u>CAR & DRIVER</u> has named the 944 (over the 911 and 928) as the best handling imported car. Conspicuously missing from the test group were the Datsun 300ZX and the Mazda RX-7. What's next? "Chevrolet Camaro Z-28 versus Porsche 944 at forty paces." The Camaro was previously named best handling American-built car.

The German auto-worker and machinist strike is having more effect than just a shortage of cars. Also effected are replacement parts -- racing engine rebuilding parts included. Both TAG - Porsche and BMW G.P. engines are becoming scarce along with 956 parts. And Indy-Cosworths are a big user of German supplied valve springs that have to be replaced after each race, 4 per cylinder, 32 per engine, 1056 per typical race field.

Volkswagen of America is recalling about 26,000 1982-'84-model Porsche 911s, 924s and 944s to replace their rear seat belt assemblies. VWoA said the cars are equipped with manually adjustable belts, but federal standards require seat belts to adjust and lock automatically.

John A. Cook, Porsche Cars of North American's president at a May 1st press conference in Detroit - "Base-line" requirements, for dealers who sell from zero to 49 Porsches per year, include: One demonstrator, two showroom units, six new cars in stock, one Porsche salesman, one Porsche-trained mechanic, three Porsche-specific work stalls and one Porsche-specific service hoist." and "As for new product, the PCNA president said he would like to bring a four-wheeldrive 911 model to the States and said the parent company currently was studying the feasibility of offering a car in a market segment below the 944. "Nothing is in development," he said, "but we are studying that end of the market."

Cook also said he felt Porsche could very successfully sell a larger performance sedan and hinted the company someday may compete in that market along with Mercedes-Benz, Jaquar and BMM."

Skip Barber - do not pass go go directly to jail, do not collect \$200.00; actually a man who conducts a driving school by the same name.


Speedster - ie bathtub, not necessarily the fastest car at Grattan, but close - definitely the cutest!

#### GUIDE TO HIGH PERFORMANCE HANDLING

The keys to high performance handling are a top quality suspension system, proper chasis adjustments and properly balanced tire presures. Aim for the theoretical ideal NEUTRAL STEER: matched front and rear traction. UNDERSTEER is a plowing or pushing effect when cornering: OVERSTEER is the rear sliding outward on turns.






Subject: Autocross Site Change

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


