




Anyway, there's a lot of great action coming up. On August 12, we venture to Indiana to defend our reputation as trophy hounds in the first IROC






### MOTOR & SPORT FRANK WAGNER




### TECHNICAL



Member Pete Bax sent us this photo taken at the Aberden Proving Grounds in Missouri. The plaque in the foreground reads, "The self-propelled gun, PAK 43 was one of Germany's largest combat vehicles during World War 11. The 8.8 centimeter (3.5 inches) PAK 43 gun was mounted on the tiger tank chassis, and was called the "Tiger Porsche" for its de-

signer, Dr. Ferdinand Porsche. The Germans nicknamed it the "Elephant". The power plant was unusual in that it consisted of a v-type, 12 cylinder liquid-cooled, gasoline engine, which drove an electric generator on each track. The muzzle velocity was 3,200 feet per second and the maximum range approximately 14,000 yards. Weight approximately 71 tons."


