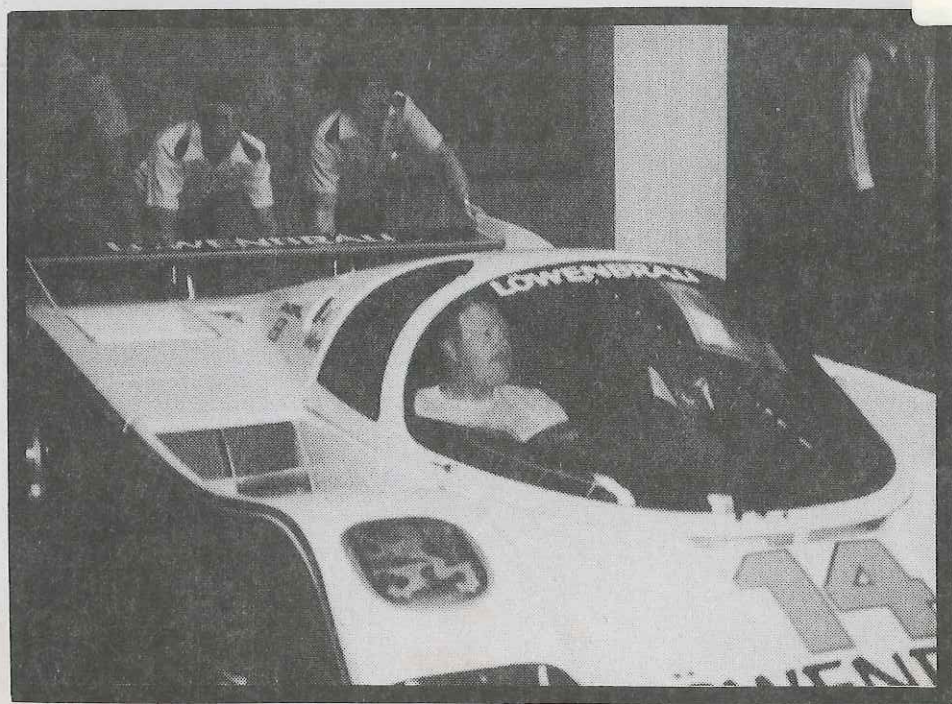

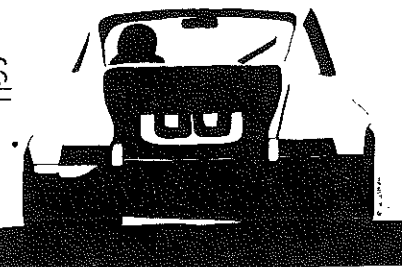

VICE PRESIDENT - This year we are selecting two Co-VP's -- Judy Cull and Lance Weersma -- because we've found this is a major job and very time consuming for just one person.

Judy Cull is an extremely experienced and capable PCA'er. She's been a vice president before, is an enthusiastic rallyist and driver, and is the defacto timing expert in the club. Her husband, Phil "Build it from the ground up" Cull is just as involved in the club as Judy is.

Lance Weersma is our resident 912 hotshoe and has been Fixed Asset Chairman (he keeps our pylons and timing equipment safe and secure) for years. An enthusiastic auto-crosser and rallyist, Lance has been many an event chairman's saving grace -- by handling starting, tech, and corner workers.

Judy and Lance will help Frank plan events and are responsible for selecting event chairpersons and making sure that the event is properly planned and carried off. Big, big job folks!

TREASURER - Peggy Riddle. Peggy transferred to our region from Indiana several years back. Since then, she's been an active auto-crosser, chaired Winterfest '84, worked registration at numerous events, and helped make lots of other events happen. Oh, she also happens to be a CPA with one of the largest accounting firms in the world. I don't imagine we'll have to worry about debits getting credited or whatever.

Peggy will also help the President and Vice Presidents with event planning. In addition, she'll be responsible for working with the President to develop the annual Financial Plan, plus all financial transactions, a monthly financial report and newsletter advertising billing and collection.

Please help me communicate my sincere thanks to the 600+ members of PCA for signing the petition to have my name placed on the national ballot for the office of treasurer for the 1985-86 term.

As of this writing, the petitions are on their way to PCA National. We don't yet know if my name will be on the ballot. The exact date that is used to determine the number of members and the number of verified petition signators are unknown today.

This is an appropriate time to express my basic views (platform, if you will) to the voting membership. First and foremost, I think the functioning and decision making of and for the club should be more open and able to receive member input. That can be accomplished by publishing, well in advance, the agenda for council and board meetings so the zone reps/presidents can vote on issues based on the members' views.

Secondly, I think there should be a dollar limit on any single club purchase or expenditure without membership approval. The treasurer's office should have the responsibility of monitoring this and of informing the members of the pros and cons of large expenses, such as the purchase of a computer before it is brought to a vote of the board.
