



Recently Wayne, Hutch and I met with our counterparts from Western Michigan and Motorstadt Regions for an organizational meeting for the 1985 IROC Series. For those new members let me give some background on the series. In 1974 a group of autocross enthusiasts from Michigan Indiana, Motorstadt, and Western Michigan Regions got together and decided they could host better and more fun events if they joined in a series of events with each region hosting an event and the other regions attending and supporting. These enterprising enthusiasts decided to name the series after the International Race of Champions which that year used equally prepared Porsche Carerras (also called Jelly Bean Racers -affectionately by Porsche People and with spite by Corvette drivers). Now you know where the Interregional Race of Champions got its name.

The series has had some good years and some lean times when some wanted to let it die. Chicago Region joined us for a while too. I believe the series is improving and getting stronger and that 1985 could be the very best ever. I am going to give it my best shot, can I count on your support?

All the events this year are medium speed events on parking lots or a stock car oval with figure eight. There will be no high speed race track-type event as it stands now. Novice drivers can feel comfortable at all the events and there is minimal risk to your pride and joy.

Some of the highlights of the changes for '85 are as follows. (My comments follow)

- 1. Classes will police themselves for progression points. Cars will be classed at registration-Tech inspection is for safety, not for classing purposes
- 2. Late registration for drivers will close for a class when timed runs for that class begin. (This still allows a late commer to register but sets a practical off time. Try to get to the events on time-such late commers play havoc with the organizers.)
- 3. Protests of classification are closed with the first timed run of any car. (if you think someone is too fast during practice and doesn't belong in your class, protest before timed runs begin. The IROC Representatives are the protest committee).
- 4. The IROC Trophy Fund was increased to \$3.00 per IROC entrant. (\$3.00 of your entry fee at each event goes toward year end trophies. Non IROC entrants still pay the full entry fee for the event but the \$3.00 goes to the treasury.)
- 5. Parade Competition Rules from '84 will apply in '85 including tire rules.
- 6. Classing will be by '84 PCR's except Ladies Classes.
- 7. Ladies Classes are as follows:

- a. Class L-1 All 4 cylinder stock.
- Class L-2 All 6 & 8 cylinder stock and 4 cylinder improved.
- c. Class L-3 All 4 cylinder modified & 4 cylinder turbo
- d. Class L-4 All 6 & 8 cylinder Improved, Modified and 6 cylinder turbo.

There was much discussion about whether we should have ladies classes and how to establish a fair system. We hope this will allow the women to feel more comfortable and encourage more women to participate.

8. A '75 or better Snell approved helmet will be required and will be checked at Tech Inspection. (This is a more stringent rule than PCR's but is still a 10 years old helmet. I personally have an '80 Snell approved helmet I highly recommend a similar helmet. Western Michigan Region will require a '75 or better helmet at all their events.)

I have to add to the helmet discussion, there are vendors in Pano selling '85 Snell approved helmets for about \$100.00. That is a big chunk of change but what is your head worth? Your Porsche is a machine and as such can be repaired to good as new, sometimes even better. But sometimes such is not the case with the human head. Remember \$10 heads wear \$10 helmets. Safety must be at the top of the list of all events. I intend to put it first at the IROC event. Keep your revs up and your rubber warm!
