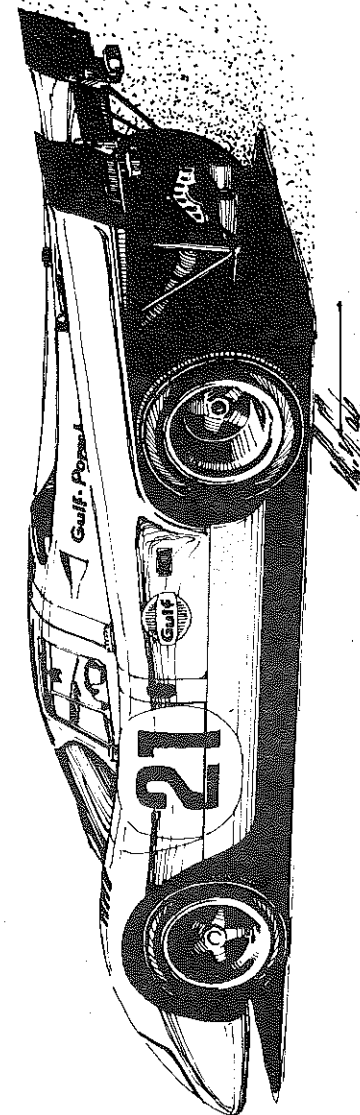
PARTS IS PARTS

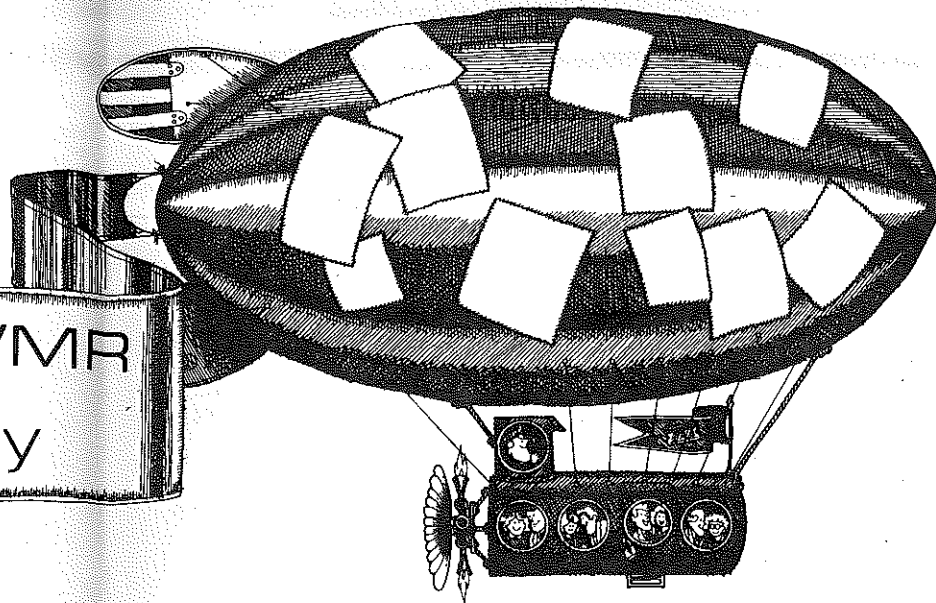
When your background for the most of your life has been medical, some of the automotive terms leave a lot of room for imagination. Some examples:

This event is set up much like our Lear Siegler event on our Holiday on Wheels. Fast and fierce, ideal for our type of vehicles. I'm talking high rpm's in second gear or maybe even some third gear.
