





It was nice to spend time with people we don't see often and some we won't see until Winterfest time.





Porsche Winter Storage Tips

Battery - remove, store indoors, allow to discharge, then recharge.

Tires - Leave on car, Raise pressure to 40 lbs. Place carpet or board under tires.


Oil - Bring up to operating temp; change oil and filter, bring back to operating temp and shut down.

Gas - car should have full tank with fuel stabilizer; (refer to boating or RV dealer.

Clutch - to inhibit rust buildup activate clutch once or twice a month. Keep pedal cluster clean and dry.

Body - Clean and wax properly; be sure all moisture is removed. Clean interior and apply protectant. Leave windows slightly open. Cover with breathable material.

Son of Easy Rider, Sleazy Car Salesmen, EP Turns Three

Remeber Easy Rider? It was on HBO recently, and I believe I know why. It's to pique your interest for a sequel that may be in the works, updated to take into account that the joints, fringed-leather vests, VW busses and choppers, communes and "wow, mans" of the 60's have become the Perrier, Murjani, European sports sedans, condos and "interpersonal dialogues" of the '80s.


Imagind this as the pl9t of Easy Rider II-The Legend Continues; Billy (Dennis Hopper) and Captain America (Peter Fonda) weren't killed by the shotgun-toting rednecks in the pick-up truck on that back-country road, just seriously injured. They recover and sue everyone in sight. Fifteen years later, the day before the case comes to trial, they settle out of court, receiving \$14 million from the two rednecks, the maker of the pickup-truck-shotgun rack (who should have known that without the rack making the shotgun readily available, the rednecks wouldn't have and the ability to blow away Captain and Billy), the country(for failint to adequately protect the highways and byways, thus depriving long-hairs of their federal civil right), and the maker of the motorcycle gasoline tank that exploded, taking with it the ill-gotten drug profits hidden inside (poor engineering design and failure to anticipate currency-carrying as a possible and likely use of the tank). The court attaches the bank accounts of the two good ol' boys, who'd spent the time since the first film doing "I Am the NRA" commercials.

With the settlement, Billy and Captain America (now known as J. William Overstreet II and Atty Captain America, P.C.) buy an IBM PC AT back in L.A., use it to track the currency markets, and make a killing with a three-way straddle involving the dollar, the yen, and gray-market-RMW futures. FOr a respite from work, they buy a 635 CSi coupe and set out across America

to see America's greatest cultural pageant—the Live Aid concert in Philadelphia.


In a series of hassles paralleling <u>Easy Rider I</u>, they are harassed along the way by police because their affluent lifestyle (and inability to keep it to 55 in the Beemer) makes them repugnant to the Man. They're again shot at by rednecks in pick-up trucks who yell, 'Why'nt you buy American, you faggot yuppies?' Captain and Billy make amends by passing the truck, and Billy heaves a bottle of Pellegrino water out the sunroof; its perfect arc smashes the windshield of the good ol' boys' pickup truck. In a flashback to the commune of <u>Easy Rider I</u>, they meet up with the now-grown daughters of the women Billy



tried to seduce the first time around. One of the women agrees, but only in the back seat of the CSi; Peter Fonda vetoes the idea because it's so hard to keep up the leather upholstery.

Alcoholic lawyer George Hanson (Jack Nicholson) is no longer in the movie; brain-damaged, not killed in the roadside clubbing, he's back in California promoting mandatory helmet laws with a twist - he wants people to wear them round-the-clock in Dixie states. So they instead pick up Pee Wee Herman, playing a stranded Wharton MBA whos Saab Turbo lost its intercooler. At a roadside diner, they impress a half-dozen giggling teenage girls who know the BMW parked outside means cash parked in the bank. As in the first film, they're refused service, not because of their hair this time, but because the diner doesn't take American Express. Worried about herpes, they bypass the hookers at the House of Blue Lights in New Orleans, but do meet up with Madonna; viewers should note little difference.

Billy and Captain America arrive in time for the Live Aid concert, but can't find a covered, guarded garage for the CSi, so they entrust it to the streets, where the radio is soon ripped from the dash and a resulting short circuit ignites the highpressure-line to the fuel injection. (RMW NA refuses to pay because the line was rerouted by a gray market certifier now under indictment by the California attourney general's office.) An aerial pan shows a rising plume of smoke, Captain America mutters, "We blew it, Billy," and the credits roll to the sound of Prince singing the Rolling Stones' "You Can't Always Get What You Want". The film flashcuts between The Big Chill and Easy Rider I as the house lights come on.


Well Race Fans, this has been another stupendous year for Porsche Racing. I am so proud of all my racing cousins I could hit my rev limiter.

The 959 Rally car won the Paris-Dekar Rally this spring. Although Porsche has pretty well withdrawn from the rally competition due to the danger of the sport, the 959 proved itself to be the best. From the 959 evolved the 961. The what? The 961- IMSA racing version of the 959. One key point of racing is timing. As Porsche President has said, the best car in the world won't win the race if it's not ready when the green flag is waved. The GROUP B class is no longer, so the 961 is without a class. The IMSA GTX rules limit the 961 to the point that is isn't very competitive (did you watch the 3 hour Daytona race?). Skinny tires don't cut it. But, rules change - maybe to Porsche's advantage this time.

My cousins, the 956 and 962 gang reigned supreme in the World Prototype Sportscar Championship (WPSC) and International Motor Sport Association (IMSA). Derek Bell and Al Holbert earned top total points respectively in the factory sponsored entries, and won each championship. The Porsche 962 of Rob Dyson wins the Porsche Cup. THe Porsches have also come on the IMSA Camel Light Scene. The 911-based engine was the power plant for several chassis types. The down side of Porsche success is that BMW has withdrawn from GTP for 87, and Jaguar is talking of a single car team. On the other hand, Ford may market the Probe to customer racing teams.

And, history was made again in Formula 1. Alain Prost in the #1 Tag-Porsche powered Marlboro McLaren won the World Championship for the 2nd year in a row. This is the 3rd consecutive victory for McLaren - an unprecedented event. Never has a team clinched the title 3 years in a row. Remember that in '84, Prost was only ½ point behind champion team mate Nikki Lauda. Can they do it again?

A special salute to all the engineers, designers, crews and drivers of Porsche Racing Teams for a great season of racing. We all say a prayer to the memory of Joe Gartner, who lost his life this year while drivin at Le Mans. A bittersweet victory for the factory team of Holbert, Bell and Stuck. Safety at the track is a number one concern for everyone, and we all stop and think twice when a tragedy occurs. Men like Jackie Stewart are actively promoting track and car safety, and we have seen great improvements in the last few years.



It's back to the drawing board for a few months--actually the computer these days for the teams. I look forward to seeing them again, and reporting the results in Porsche Uber Alles. Until then, it's the garage for me. It'll feel good to kick off those heavy wheels, get an oil change and hibernate for a while. Zzzzzzzzz.







- 10. More concern at events with fun and less with profit.


