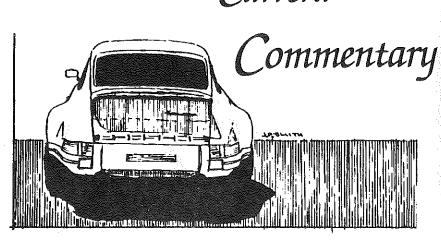

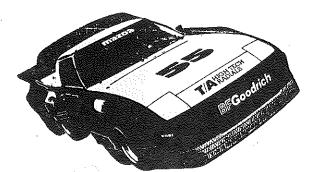

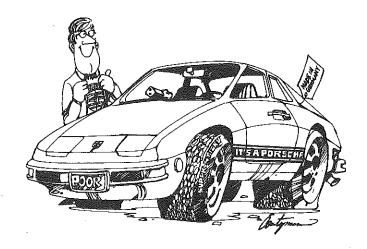
WELGOME

Short Shifted

Having driven a 911 with a short shifter kit, and liking the positive feel and the alck of rowing effect, I started keeping my eye out for a kit. (Besides, a shift in time saves .09, right). The kit I ended up with says it fits all 914s, 70,71, and 72, and all 911s through 71.

There seems to be two kinds of kits on the market. One type costs around \$110. Advertisers of this kit intimidated me from considering the other kit with a 'warning' about other kits that required gluing and cutting of the existing shifter. The glue and cut models are generally under \$40. Actually no cutting my be involved.

Still it seems very non-OEM to be gluing a shifting mechanism. So, I made it a point to call two of the lower priced sellers and inquire what they meant by "materials included". More specifically, did they mean epoxy glue. The first just gave me a straight yes answer and my reply was no thanks.

The second seller explained thusly. The tube that has the shift knob on the end actually is glued at the factory at two ends. One is the end to which the shift knob is attached. The other end is glued into the shifting mechanism. In fact, the mchanism cannot be disassembled for installation of a short shift kit without ungluing one of the ends. So, a kit that advertises no gluing may not be telling the whole story. It may be welded at the bottom connections but the shift knob remains a glue point. This seller also offered to allay my fear of epoxy by offering to heli-arc the set up if I would send the unbolted mechanism. There would be a \$15 charge for this. While the price didn't seem bad, I didn't like the idea of parting with my shifter. Perhaps there is some deep Freudian explanation. Anyway, I just ordered the kit, epoxy glue and all. Soon it was here.

The initial disassembly is very conventional. Three 13mm head bolts, 2 10mm head bolts and it lifts out. Two spring loaded pins and the shift rod separates from the holding mechanism. The top part (cover) then slides up to the shift knob end and one can get down to business. The bottom part is the part to be replaced. The new part is about 3/8" longer than the original. That shortens the throw on the other (shift knob) end.

By heating the old part with a torch or gas stove, the epoxy glue lets go. I used a torch. It all of a sudden popped apart. Before doing so, however, I marked the position of the shift rod relative to the slot in the lowere piece to be replaced. I just used a center punch to mark the center of the slot on the shift rod.

The next step involved gluing the new part to the shift rod. After cleaning the rod, the epoxy was mixed, dabbed into and all around the inside of the hole of the new part, and the shift rod was slid in. The mark was aligned. Next it sets for a minimum of six hours for the glue to harden.

There after there is reassembly of the springs and pins of the mechanism, then bolting back into the car. The only difference is that the same 3/8" of spacemust be created between the floor of the car and the bottom of the shifting mechanism, since the new part that protrudes downward (into the rod that goes back to the transmission) is now 3/8" longer. My kit contained only a spacer and longer replacement bolts for the two 10 mm head bolts. After contemplating the bending effect of not spacing the three larger bolts, and trying to decide whether this was inteded, I opted for a trip to Okemos hardware for three longer metric bolts and enough wide washers to make the space uniform.

The only other wrinkle was in finding that the plastic shift bushing was worn. It is an under \$3.00 item. This forms the joint interface between the transmission rod socket and the very bottom of the shift rod ball. That alone might have accounted for a large supply of slop in the shift. For those not desiring to do a short shift kit but wanting a more positive shift, this might be checked out.

So far, it looks and feels good. Of course, the weather and winter preclude a moving test.

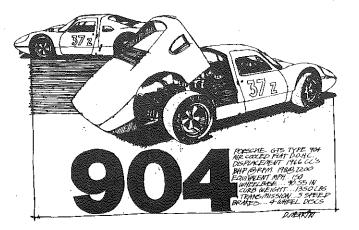
We will have a third speaker, yet to be announced. Don't worry, you'll love it.

Cleaning It Up

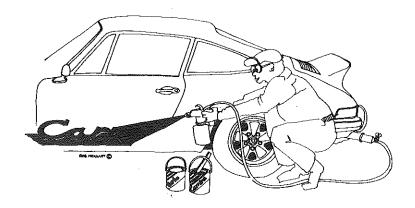

The care of paint is a mystery to many Porsche owners. It is basic and simple, by using soft cotton towels and plenty of clean water. Commercial car washes are tempting but can grind paint thin and ruin alloy wheels in only one visit.

Start with the roof and work down. Remember, if you see the water evaporate, the surface is too hot and will water spot. A good practice is to reflush every panel as you proceed. Leave wheels and lower rockers for last because that will keep the grit out of your towel. Should you use soap? It is a good measure for a dirty car. Cold water liquid Woolite of a drop of Lemon JOy works well. It also removes oil film and acts as a lubricant to prevent scratches. More than a cap full will take its toll on the wax, so go easy with the scrubbing bubbles.

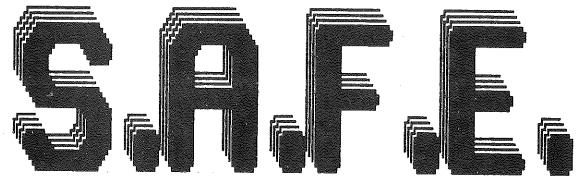
Many older car buffs think the chamois is the last word in car care. A cotton towel (Holiday Inn special) can run circles around the chamois. It absorbs more, does not trap dirt(read washable), does not drag wax off the paint surface and deposit it on the galss (chamois do remove wax-Ed.), and they are great to cry in if you lose at a Concours.

There is much controversy about tooth brushes and Q-tips. The next time you are waxing your Porsche and you get that white buildup around the lenses and moldings, try a super soft tooth brush, it gets the white out. It will also work well on metal surfaces — aluminum, carburetors, etc. then a bit of Blue Magic, and wonders never cease. Q=tips can reach small cracks and crevices athat only a judge's finger can reach. For dust, they work well when slightly moist. When getting the last bit of grime from engine castings, dip the Q-tip in Kerosene or DuPont 3812S enamel reducer.



Was is as controversial as multi-grade oil. Whatever you decide on, don't use the dumb handy applicator that comes with it. A piece of turkish towel the size of a tennis ball works best (or just use your hand to apply - Ed.) Remember not to apply too much because it will find its way under the black trim and around the screw heads on lenses. Work the wax in one foot sections and buff to a luster. A cotton T-shirt works well, but remember to keep the seams tucked away as they can abrade the surface. When you complete one side, wipe the panels with a damp terry towel. It will blend the wax, thereby eliminating the patchwork effect of excess wax.

Turtle Wax made a product called Black Top Wax. It worked well on neoprene surfaces, 914 bumper trim, 911 black bumper moldings, and even 914 bumper trim, and 914 roofs. The product worked well, but the decline of black vinyl roofs led to the development of a clear top dressing. It still works well and does not leave deposits on paint surfaces. The treatment was almost like polishing black shoes on a white rug, so that this new material is much easier to use.

Tech Session - Lori Riley - Still trying for third speaker, Lori urges us to get our applications in soon.

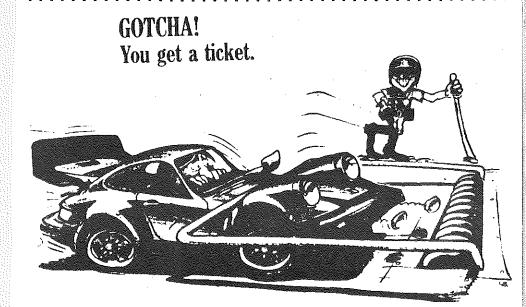

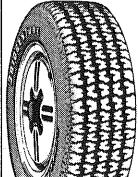
