

Dinner Drive......Sunday,July 20, 2008 ALMS / Acura Sports Car Challenge at The Score Contributed by Dan Phillips

A group of about 20 Porsche enthusiasts gathered on Sunday, July 20th at The Score sports bar and restaurant, just northeast of Grand Rapids, to watch the 2008 Acura Sports Car Challenge ALMS race.





The event was preceded by a "spirited" drive through the beautiful tree-lined winding roads of nearby Cannon, Ada, and Plainfield townships. Meeting at picturesque Townsend Park in Cannonsburg, seven Porsches enjoyed some shade while the drivers and navigators enjoyed some coffee and conversation. Even some out-of-towners joined the morning drive, including a Muskegon contingent of Jerry King in his white 964 Speedster and Jim and Ardis Schaaf in their midnight blue Cayman, as well as John and Marshall Walters in their silver 911 SC from Allegan County. A new member, Jeremy Nelson of Sand Lake, joined us with his heavily modified '79 911 with a 930 widebody coupe, slant-nose, and an engine tweaked with cams, exhaust, and other mods. Once underway, our drivers discovered (or re-discovered) some great roads for driving their Porsches on, such as Bailey Drive near Vergennes in Ada, or the stretch of Michigan Street between Crahen Ave and Grand River Drive.

Several other enthusiasts met the driving crowd later at The Score, located at 5301 Northland Drive, Grand Rapids, MI. NBC Sports broadcast a tape-delayed recording of Saturday's ALMS race from Mid-Ohio, while ABC Sports broadcast the IRL race live from the same track. Lucas Luhr in an Audi R10 took first overall, while the Penske Porsche RS Spyder driven by Romain Dumas took top honors in LMP2. Ferrari beat Porsche by 1:04.135 in GT2.

Fun was had by all, including Ren Phillips, who showed Rick Riley how to make a "Red Dog" by pouring beer into her Bloody Mary.....



The route took about 1 1/2 hours and covered about 40 miles, ending at the checkpoint at the head of our driveway.



The assortment of Porsches is always fun to see at these events, and we were honored that Rick Riley chose to debut his new adorable orange 356 Speedster D. Too cute for words.


First Prize was awarded to Terry & Dorilee Shieble, Second to Dan & Ren Phillips and Third to Dale & Cindy Siekman.







ROUTE 66 ROAD TRIPS - SPRINGFIELD ILLINOIS INTERNATIONAL ROUTE 66 MOTHER ROAD FESTIVAL

September in Springfield offers a respite from the start of school and the end of summer, with its *International Route 66 Mother Road Festival*, September 26 - 28, 2008 (www.route66fest.com). If you like big car shows, but not big crowds - this is a great show to attend! Springfield plays the perfect host, closing ten+ square blocks of historic downtown and providing hundreds of volunteers to create a wonderful weekend car show get-away.

Getting there is easy — via the faster highway route of 96-80 to 57 south, or by taking the 'Mother Road,' starting in Chicago for the adventurous, or from Joliet for those averse to city driving. Route 66 in Illinois is very well marked, with signs at every intersection and alternate sections designated by age. If you start in Joliet, don't miss the Joliet Area Historical Museum (www.jolietmuseum.org), just a short hop from Harrah's. This museum features the rich history of Joliet, built on a major shipping canal linking the Chicago River with the Illinois River - 96 miles dug by Irish immigrants. Other attractions in Joliet include the train station and a high school that looks like a castle.

Traveling south takes you through small towns with quaint diners, over aging concrete, and past phantom ghost signs on building walls. Gardner offers an old-time restored gas station across from a new coffee shop built from piggybacked semis. There's also a Frank Lloyd Wright bank downtown. Pontiac has the Route 66 Association of Illinois museum (www.il66assoc.org). Odell features a restored gas station museum and several stretches of 'older' road that can be accessed for photo ops. Lexington and Towanda both have roadside parks built on abandoned sections of the road. You'll find Funks Grove Maple "Sirup" shop and the historic Funk Prairie Home in Shirley, also a nature sanctuary off the road a bit (www.sugargrovenaturecenter.org). Don't miss the Giant Hot Dog Man in Atlanta! This fine example of advertising art was moved from Cicero and restored by the Illinois association.

Heading into Springfield, you can't miss Shea's gas station, with its eclectic collection of roadside "stuff." Stop in at the Cozy Dog for an original battered hotdog on a stick and your journey is complete! Travel time, taking the scenic route, is about seven hours. You will arrive in Springfield late afternoon, in time to check into the hotel and freshen up for the evening events.

The Springfield show starts off with a bang – participating cars gather at the DOT parking lot outside of town on Friday night. On command, about 500 cars roll out to a police escort, winding through the city past cheering residents and ending with a drive up the people-packed streets of downtown. Much partying ensues!!!

Hotels are plentiful — the best spot is right downtown offering security parking and within walking distance of the show area. Saturday gives you plenty of opportunity to show off your car, listen to the many bands performing throughout the area, browse the novelty vendors, and talk to people from around the world. Yes, they really do mean 'international'! We had a nice chat over breakfast at the Hilton with an English couple whose club flew from England with their cars. There were several car clubs attending, notably a large collection of Opels. There is usually a dinner dance party event Saturday night, also bands playing throughout the city. Sunday involves more show and awards, which, like most amateur car shows, favor the 'locals' and are probably not worth staying for. I recommend breakfast at Sgt Peppers Café south of town and head home by way of the highway. Michigan City makes a nice mid-drive stop on the way home, if you have time.
