

TechSpalte: Cleaning and Restoring a Plastic Rear Window in a Convertible Top

Our Porsche Boxster, a 1998 model, has a fantastic 'butch' gangster shape to the roofline when the hood (convertible top) is up, something unique to first-generation Boxsters. This was achieved with the use of a plastic rear window, which folds in half as the top is stowed. The concept of a plastic rear window - and the inherent Z-kink flaw with this particular design - is a bit anachronistic, but the price paid for the glass rear-window 'upgrade' in 2003 was a much more frumpy shape to the top when raised. Sure, it looked closer in shape to the car with a hardtop fitted, but nowhere near as cool-looking as the older version. And, the visibility got worse too.

But not all aspects of the plastic window will be missed. Many would not fold neatly in the center, resulting in the common 'Z'-shaped kink that appears (and ruins) so many of these rear windows. We have to get out of the car when the top is half-way down and give a little karate-chop to the center Z-kink so the rear window folds up nicely. Could the shape have been tweaked to avoid this? Maybe it could have been designed to be removeable, and available as a service part so that it could be removed, thrown away, and replaced in a matter of minutes? Oh well...it is what it is at this point.



Note the difference between the 'before' and 'after' sections. The white-out, or 'crazing' band in the center has nearly disappeared as well.

Still, you <u>can</u> make your rear window look a whole lot better - if not brand new - without replacing the top. It just needs a good cleaning, some super-fine polishing compound and some elbow grease. This is a fairly simple, straight-forward job that a person with virtually no mechanical skills can accomplish in about an hour. You will require a polishing and cleaning compound, some clean, soft and dry cotton rags/cloths, and a micro-fiber dusting cloth. You will also need some warm water and dishsoap in a small bucket.



These specialty polishing compounds are out there in a number of variations, but I used a restoring polish from a small company called Upper Bound in Northville, MI - just search for their store and product on eBay. It comes in a small container about the same as a small lipgloss jar or Carmex tin, and there's enough to do your rear window about 2-3 times, both sides.

A critical point here is to wait until the weather is warmer, or else do it in a heated garage after your rear window has had time to acclimatize. You can also warm up the clear plastic with a hair-dryer to make it more pliable, and thus harder to damage as you work on it. Don't worry - the rear

window is 40-gauge DOT-rated plastic, typically a vinyl-based compound. It's very tough, but it's still plastic, which means it has a tendancy to get harder (less elastic) as it gets colder. Have you ever seen a plastic part get bent, and at the bent area the plastic turns white? This is called 'crazing', where the material develops a great number of extremely small micro-fissures, or cracks, internal to the material. The collection of small cracks inside the strained area can make a trasparent plastic turn transluscent or opaque. This is what happened to our plastic rear window when we lowered it one day when the weather (and the rear window) was just too cold. We then had a band of white across the center of the rear window about 2" wide because we basically bent the window in half when cold, causing major crazing along the fold line. Since crazing occurs on the surface as well as internal to the material thickness, a polishing compound coupled with a good cleaning can significantly reduce the crazed appearance.

First, clean the window inside and out with warm tap water and a little dish soap. To ease access, drop the top down about half way, and remove the windstop from the rollbars. You'll be amazed at how dirty the inside of your rear window will be! Once it's thoroughly clean, inside and out, you'll already see a big difference. Now for the polishing compound. This will not only remove, blend and fill in micro-scratches and cracks, but also scrub any remaining nastiness off the surface. Apply by hand with one or two fingers through a soft-cotton rag in a tight swirling motion, with a hand behind your working area to support the material. The more you polish, the more you scrub, the better the outcome. It's like taking a micro rubbing compound to the surface of the plastic.

Finally, after your polish has dried to a haze, buff it off in the same manner with a micro-fiber cloth, which will pick up any dust. It's almost like a wax job. You'll be amazed at the difference when you clear the haze. While the 1st application gives you the most for your time, try going through the process a couple of times, especially in problem areas. Our rear window now has almost no evidence of the crazing anymore, and basically went from 160,000 miles to about 20,000 miles in about an hour. Brilliant!




