

TechSpalte: Buying a Used Car? Consider a Used Car Inspection by a Qualified Technician

Whether you are buying a "new" used car, a second car or upgrading your Porsche, here are a few tips that can save you a bundle.

Obtaining a true history of a vehicle's service record or history of any accidents is important when determining a vehicles fair market value. That's were services such as Carfax can come in handy. If you are buying a newer model with under 30,000 miles, most likely the Carfax will be fairly accurate. The service record should be correct due to the car having been under warranty for most of the miles. As for body damage, most collisions will be reported on the Carfax. However what may not be shown are repairts that are due to minor parking lot mishaps, scratches, or things being dropped on the vehicle. Smaller panel repairs may not be reported because the owner chose to pay for the repair out of pocket rather than turning it into his insurance. Circumstances like this make it wise to have the car inspected by a professional who can detect any work not reported.

As far as the mechanical end of the vehicle, your Carfax will not tell you that the car is due for brakes, belts or other normal service items. It may have had the inspection, but that does not mean all is new. Most people let items of wear go if they are trading a car in! As with any used car purchase, your best information is to have the vehicle's service records. With these records you'll know what has been done or what may have been recommended and not repaired.

Because of issues such as these, having a professional perform a UCI is extremely important. Items with wear that need replacing do not make a car a poor purchase, as long as you know you're going to have that expense.

Knowing the cost of any necessary repairs provides you with a bargaining chip while discussing your final purchase price. We recommend you add the cost of the repair to the purchase price to determine if you are paying a fair market value for the vehicle. On older high mileage cars, Carfaxes can become very vague. In this case having the service records can be very beneficial and an unbiased UCI by a third party is very important.

What should a used car inspection include? A good inspection will include a system check of all electricals, engine performance, possible leaks, belts, hoses, suspension, tires, brakes, fluid conditions and levels as well as body and paint condition. Our inspection form has six pages and too many items to list here, but suffice it to say that it includes a check of every area and system in the vehicle.

Let's take a look at a couple of areas requiring inspection, body and mechanical:

- How can you tell if the body has been painted? Lift the rubber seals. Is there any paint on them? Is there a fuzzy line inside the door jamb to the body edge? Can you see what looks like sand scratches in the finish? Does the color look different from one panel to the next? Is there overspray inside the wheel wells? If yes to any of these questions, the car has been painted to some degree and additional inspection is warranted.
- Now let's check out some of the mechanical systems. Does the steering feel loose or non-responsive? Do you feel any vibrations while driving the car or while braking? Are there spots on the ground under the car? Do you hear any abnormal humming sounds or growls while driving it? Does the car shift hard or harshly? Does it shift slowly or sluggishly? Are there any indicators or lights illuminated on the dash? If you answered yes to any of these questions, the car needs further inspection!

Buying a Porsche or other specialty car? Suppose the car is out of town and you don't know who should perform the inspection. Our recommendation would be that you contact a member of the local car club and ask them who they recommend. Most club members will be very happy to help you out. They may even know the car! [Ed. note - also try their local Porsche dealer, it's worked for me.]

Other alternatives would be to take a professional with you to inspect the car, or pick up one of our inspection forms and go over the car carefully yourself before you make the purchase or have it shipped. A little extra investment in the beginning may save you a bigger expense and headache in the end.

Purchasing a car sight-unseen on eBay or Auto Trader? Finding a car on eBay or Auto Trader that sounds like a deal too good to pass up and then purchasing it sight-unseen can lead to huge expenses. If this is a plan that you are considering, consider the suggestions in the paragraphs above. At the very least you had better throw a couple extra thousand to your purchase price. Rarely have I seen a car purchased from either eBay or Auto Trader that did not need service. In any case, we encourage you to buy smart and enjoy your ride!



2012 North American International Auto Show

Detroit – Porsche returned again to the 2012 North American International Auto Show (NAIAS), this time to officially introduce the all-new Porsche 911 (see Über Alles, Sept. 2011) to the US market. The Detroit show was also the world premier of the all-new Porsche 911 Cabriolet – the first official public unveiling of the new cabriolet in the world.

AUTO SHOW.

Porsche is marketing the all-new, 7th-generation 911, code-named 991, with the slogan "Porsche Identity". Porsche recognizes that the 911 represents the core identity of the Porsche marque, and is working hard to maintain that as they introduce this new generation of superlative sports cars. Lower, wider, faster, more efficient than before, this may be the best 911 yet.

Experiencing the new 911 in the flesh was truly special, and unlike past Detroit events, show patrons were actually allowed to sit in the new 911 coupe and cabriolet models. It was crowded, as this show always is, however it only required a short wait to experience the new Panamera-like center console design, the totally new dash and door panels, the excellent new seats, and the typically exquisite leather work and top-quality fit and finish. The new car takes refinement and quality up a notch, and the new car as a whole feels a little bigger than before.

Our small WMR PCA group met with many other PCA members from other Zone 4 regions, a total of over 80 people. We split into two groups and entered one group at a time into the Porsche hospitality area, inside their show display. We sat comfortably in the quiet enclave above the rest of the show, with a great view of the floor through the tinted one-way glass. We enjoyed the modern, minimalist architecture and furniture while Peter and Inesha from Porsche walked us through the design, features, and specs of the new 911, and answered any questions we had.

After this highlight, we enjoyed the rest of the show as we saw fit, and some PCA members returned to the Dearborn Inn for dinner and another night's stay. The Western Michigan Region would like to thank Ron Carr for coordinating this event. This is a really fun thing to do, and the VIP treatment by Porsche is a real treat. The All-New 2012 Porsche Boxster

The new Boxster generation – the mid-engine roadster from Porsche Lighter and more muscular, more distinctive and more fuel-efficient

Stuttgart – Never before in the history of the Porsche Boxster was a change of generation so comprehensive. The open-top two-seater car is being marketed with a completely new lightweight body and a completely revamped chassis. Considerably lower weight, longer wheelbase, a wider track and larger wheels significantly enhance yet further the mid-engine sports car's driving dynamics, already far and away the best in its class, supported by the new electro-mechanical power steering. The new Boxsters boast superior performance and are also up to 15 per cent more fuelefficient. Depending on model, they get by with significantly less than eight litres of fuel per 100 kilometres.



The new Boxster thus delivers what the fundamentally changed styling with shorter overhangs, significantly forward-shifted windscreen, flatter silhouette and expressive edges promises. The passengers are enclosed by the completely redesigned, fully electric hood, which now dispenses with a convertible top compartment lid. The interior concept offers the occupants more space and reflects the new Porsche outline with the raked centre console, which, originating with the Carrera GT, ensures further improved ergonomics in all models.

The new sports car generation makes its debut in the classic Porsche pairing of Boxster and Boxster S. Both models are powered by flat-six engines with direct petrol injection, the efficiency of which is further enhanced by electrical system recuperation, thermal management and start/stop function. The base model's new power unit delivers 265 hp (195 kW) from a 2.7 litre displacement – ten hp more than its larger displacement predecessor. Technically, it is now based on the 3.4-litre engine of the Boxster S. This now delivers 315 hp (232 kW), which is five hp more than before. Both models feature a manual six-speed gearbox as standard with the seven-speed Porsche Doppelkupplungsgetriebe (PDK) available as an option. Both sports cars achieve their best fuel consumption and acceleration performance with the PDK. The Porsche Boxster's fuel consumption with PDK is 7.7 l/100 km and 8.0 l/100 km for the Boxster S. With gear changes without interruption to the power flow, the Boxster sprints from zero to 100 km/h in 5.7 seconds, the Boxster S in 5.0 seconds.

To enhance driving dynamics yet further, Porsche offers the Sport Chrono Package as an optional extra for the Boxster, featuring dynamic transmission mounts for the first time. Also new in the Boxster is Porsche Torque Vectoring (PTV) with mechanical rear axle differential lock..

The market launch of the new Boxster generation will be on 14.04.2012. The basic list price in Germany will be 48,291 euro for the Boxster and 59,120 euro for the Boxster S, including 19 per cent value added tax in both cases.
