





Pilgrimage to Petit Le Mans at Road Atlanta

There it is again, the end of the driving season. It feels like it always ends before it's really started around here. By the way, it's a customary German tradition to complain about something right away – then, we apologize for it.

So let me tell you about the trip my friend Tim and I took down south to Georgia and our pilgrimage to the endurance racing event known as Petit Le Mans.

This year was bitter-sweet as the American Le Mans Series is winding down operations and is being absorbed into the TUDOR United Sports Car Championship, a merger with NASCAR. Let's hope for the best.

Then, there was the rain. Yes, I'm complaining again, aren't I? Well, it did rain a lot, but we braved the elements anyway, both on our journey down and trackside. Arriving at the "Porscheplatz" car corral Thursday morning, I was keen to sign up for Friday's Porsche Parade Lap.

The event itself lasts for 4 days in total with lots of support races, which are certainly exciting with some very close racing. So there's something for everyone.

For us, we started walking the entire track, to and from every corner, the paddock, vendor village, and so on. It's no small feat, especially since the track is divided by a large hill with very steep access roads. It doesn't hurt to get a bit of exercise, right?

Eventually, we reached the top of Spectator Hill overlooking the downhill esses, the signature mark of Don Panoz's track. The Porsche GT3 Cup Challenge commenced, and we enjoyed the sights, sounds, and on-track action.

Believe it or not, but the sun came out too. That improved our moods, the racing, the consumption of one or two adult beverages, and subsequently our appetites. Sure, we had some Southern BBQ, but our favorite place was Ted's Montana Grill in Buford. We enjoyed some Bison Steaks that were out of this world. Nice ambiance too, and of course the famed Southern courtesy and hospitality.

Saturday we walked the Grid just before the race was going Green. All the cars were parked Le Mans-style and flanked by grid girls, crew chiefs and just one or two confident racecar drivers.

At 11:30 AM the pre-race ceremony concluded and the

It's hard to convey the sense of speed and some of the racing action in a paragraph and as a spectator it can also be boring at times, truth be told. That's why it's great to bring company. So we can discuss racing lines, mishaps, engines, suspension setups and aero parts.

So, if you've never been to a race, go. If you've never taken your Porsche to an Autocross or a track day, do it. I will borrow the famous line from the Le Mans movie: "Racing is life. Everything before or after is just waiting."

We packed our bags and set off back to Michigan under warmer temps and a spotless sky. Go figure. In fact, it was so nice that we took full advantage of the Smokey Mountains vs. driving around them on the interstate. Roof down. Foot down.

The Tail of the Dragon, they call it. Just one of the many winding scenic roads going up and down the foothills of the Appalachian mountains. Folks from Michigan can only dream of 318 curves back to back, within an 11 mile stretch of road. It was definitely worth taking the road less traveled, but be advised – these roads can be dangerous.

TechSpalte: Building Your Own Car Ramps (Suitable for Use with a Porsche!)

This fun winter project contributed by WMR PCA member and Über Alles Editor Dan Phillips

This month, Tim Thatcher is taking a much-needed break, so please enjoy this article, reproduced in part from the original version I published on RennTech.org back on 06 Feb 2006. For the complete article and more pics, please refer to:

I've been disappointed by off-the-shelf car ramps from auto parts stores and even high-end specialty catalogs. They all seem to be too low to the ground, too narrow for big 'monster meats', too steep of an approach angle so they won't fit under a low air dam or exhaust, and generally flimsy. So I built my own, to my own specifications. My requirements were:

- 1. Extra width and no side channels, for extra-wide tires
- 2. Shallow approach angle for cars w/low ground clearance
- 3. Extra height for more working space under vehicles with low ground clearance
- 4. Very high strength for my own peace of mind

<u>Disclaimer:</u> Intermediate woodworking skills required. Use all new materials. Work carefully and join each interface with multiple fasteners for safety. If you build your own ramps based on my design, using your own materials, techniques, tools, and ideas, and then use them to work on your car, you do all of that at your own risk. Chock your tires. Safety first! There are many Porsches in the world, but only one you...


Materials List:


- 1. Four (4) 2x10s, 8 feet in length
- 2. Two (2) 2x4s, 12 feet in length
- 3. One (1) sheet of plywood, 3/4" thick, about 7 feet x 2 feet
- 4. One (1) box (approx qty=200) 2-1/2" galvanized nails (drywall screws may be substituted, and will be stronger)
- 5. Eight (8) heavy-duty grab-handles (4 per unit)

Procedure:

- 1. On each 8' section of 2x10, measure 24" from each end of the board, and draw a diagonal line between the points. Cut along this line to produce two (2) main boards from each single 8' 2x10 board. Each main board will have the shape of the side of the ramp. Each ramp will require at least four (4) main boards. (Optional for increased strength and significantly increased weight, construct each ramp out of seven (7) main boards, thus making each ramp completely solid all the way through. Use qty=7 2x10s for this.)
- 2. For ramps w/4 main boards, cut 2x4 spacer blocks to create an alternating arrangement of main board / spacer / main board / spacer / etc. Cut spacers for both the flat section and the angled section so there are periodic spacers along the entire 6-foot length of the ramps. Make 'em strong!

- 3. Assemble the base sections with lots and lots of nails and/or drywall screws. Don't be afriad to use a lot.
- 4. Cut the facing out of your plywood. Mitre the ends of the plywood to make a smooth transition between the ground and the ramps. Mitre the joint between the facing on the ramp section and the facing on the top section. Assemble facing to base sections with plenty of nails.
- 5. Use your 2x4 stock to cut "stop blocks" for the ends of the flat sections. These give you notice that your tires are at the ends of the ramps. If you do not have these, you may accidentally drive right off the end of the ramps. If you have a hard time feeling when the tires contact the blocks, stack up two (2) thicknesses of 2x4s at the ends to make your stop blocks. Make sure the two thicknesses still clear the air dam/exhaust/etc. Assemble to ends of flat top sections with liberal use of nails and/or drywall screws.
- 6. Optional, but very very handy: Affix heavy-duty grab-handles in desired locations. Note the positions and orientations of the grab handles of my ramps. One set is to carry them around and move them when in storage (stored on their ends for minimal footprint), and the other is to move the ramps into position at the vehicle.


