THE 1930'S SHELL GAS STATION AT THE GILMORE CAR MUSEUM

CHAPTER 1: THE EARLY YEARS

In 1994 I was hired as the third paid executive director of the Gilmore Car Museum in Hickory Corners, Michigan. The museum began as the personal get-away for its founder, Donald S. Gilmore who at the time was the President of the Upjohn Pharmaceutical Company in Kalamazoo, Michigan. It was a haven for Mr. Gilmore to restore and exercise the antique automobiles he purchased for his new-found hobby, collecting significant automobiles and carriages from years past. He would invite his friends out to drive and ride in these old treasures and was known to have a drink afterwards with these friends.

After his collection had grown significantly, his wife Genevieve encouraged Donald to open the museum to the public on Sunday afternoons. The collection became a museum in 1965. Shortly after I arrived in Kalamazoo in 1978 to become the executive Director of the Kalamazoo Institute of Arts, Mr. Gilmore passed away.

In 1994 I was asked to become the Executive Director of the Car Museum. By that time, the museum was floundering. Staff moral was low and local car clubs had pretty much deserted the museum. The Granddaddy of car shows presented annually by the Kalamazoo Antique Auto Restorers Club (KAARC) the "Red Barns Spectacular" was now referred to as the Red Barns Unspectacular!

One day, Dick Saddler a member of the KAARC came into the office asking if I had ever thought of building an early rural type gas station on the spiraling 90 acres of museum property. I said I had, but there was no money and at that time and we were just trying to keep the place afloat. Furthermore, even though I was very knowledgeable of museum funding sources I knew of no grant possibilities "out there" which would fit such a project.

CHAPTER 2: REALIZING THE DREAM

Several years went by and every year Mr. Saddler would stop by with the same question and the answer would be the same: "there IS no money!"

Then one day, I got a call from an old acquaintance at the Michigan Council for the Arts and Public Affairs. The gas station could now be a possibility!

In the past the council had only funded "programming" projects. This grant program funded what we in the museum world would call a "bricks & mortar project" at the tune of \$50,000. Now all I had to do to get the funds would be to write a successful proposal and if successful, match whatever the award might be. The grant application was successful and we were awarded \$45,000. Now I had to find a match.

I put the word out to our small amount of friends and members and the membership of the Classic Car Club of

America and heard nothing. Then one Sunday evening I had a call from Bob Turnguist, a member of the Classic Car Club of America and owner of a fine classic car restoration shop in New Jersey. He said that if we would name the gas station after he and his wife "Sunny" they would match the grant. I said yes.


Now we had \$90,000 enough to move ahead! I had been working on an architectural idea for the museum to increase our revenue. I called Bill Hammel, a local architect, to visualize as to what the gas station might look like. For the past few months support seemed to be increasing for the structure and off and on some member of the KAARC would drop off a photo of an old derelict gas station. One was of particular interest to me. It had an interesting roof line and other features that was much more interesting than the drawings I was first shown. Mr. Hammel proceeded with not only drawings of the station, but site plans as well.

Enter Dick Walters who was the distributer for the Shell Oil Company in Michigan. He called and said he had heard of the gas station project and wanted to see any plans I had at the time. I appeared at his headquarters in Marshall, Michigan just southeast of Hickory Corners. He liked the whole idea and asked how I intended to Brand the station and I replied I had not even thought that far ahead just yet. He asked if I would consider making it a Shell station. He said he would donate all of the various Shell items from his personal collection and get his dealers to donate funds to supplement his own financial donation. The gas station was now a 1930's SHELL GAS STATION!







So why the chart?

Please note the oil filter in Picture #1. There is a casting line on these filters, but this particular filter has a casting line that slightly swings upward. This slight upward swing provided the perfect opportunity for oil to leak out. One cause of this damaged casting line, is over torqueing at oil service; note the torque spec marked on the end of the cap in Picture #2.


