A LOOK BACK...HILLCLIMBS!

In 1962 issues of our Newsletter, you can find promos for events including the Townsend Park Speed Run, the 10th Annual Johnson Park Hill Climb, and the Alpine Speed Climb III at the Plainfield Drive In theatre all close to Grand Rapids. Editor, Paul Despres, said "It's a real nice Porsche course. In fact, I think they laid it out for Porsches especially." Before the existence of Grattan and Gingerman raceways here in western Michigan, hillclimbs were the popular way to satisfy that need for speed.

Seatbelts were one of the requirements, which you may not know, were not standard equipment even in Porsches back then. In the September issue, editor Despres informs members that "they can be purchased (from the Club) for \$6.00 per belt. This is a deal that was given to us sports car enthusiasts by one of the manufacturers...one of the best...takes 7,000 pounds of thrust". Paul's comments came after referencing an "article given to me by a seat belt manufacturer here in Grand Rapids, by name, Alof's. The name of the article is *Death in 7/10^{ths} of a Second.*"

The Saugatuck hillclimb was a collaboration between WMR/PCA and the late Western Michigan Sports Car Society better known then as the "Holland Club" and was held for a few years in the 1970's. The course used Perryman St., which is the road between the Kalamazoo River and the entrance to Oval Beach on Lake Michigan.







The Empire Hill Climb, which ran from 1964 until 1980 — once in the spring and once in the fall — and has been revived in recent years. Back in the day, nearly anyone could participate, says current race organizer Mike Kelty. "If you had an address in town, you didn't have to pay." The Twin Bays Sports Car Club in Traverse City sponsored the race, and the Empire Lions Club provided tractors to ferry spectators up the hill. The challenging, curvy course up Wilco Rd. "was made to wreck cars," Kelty was told. But the race never claimed a life. In the early days of the Empire Hill Climb, remembers local chamber of commerce historian Dave Taghon, the family-run automobile garage and gas station would sell more air than beer. "The cars would keep going after they reached the top of Empire Bluff, hook a left on M-22 and come back into town,"

says Taghon. "They'd stop and check the air pressure in their tires before racing up the hill again. We sold a lot of air!" Later on, the cars would wait at the top of the hill for their competitors, before returning to Empire in a parade of sleek racecars.







And what an interesting time in our history. I don't want to dwell in the pandemic, as this is front and center enough already. They say that adversity brings out the best of human nature, and this was so

WINTER CAR CARE FOR CARS WE KEEP DRIVING

Here's a handy list of items you'll want to perform to prepare for the coming winter weather.

Check Tire Wear. Look all the way across the face of each tire for indications of wear or damage. You can use a penny to check the tread depth. Insert the penny with Lincoln's head first into the tread, if you see the top of Lincoln's head, you need new tires.

Wiper Blades. If the wiper skips or vibrates across the windshield, they need to be replaced. In addition to checking the wipers, take a moment to check the windshield washer solvent. Make sure your sprayers are working and keep the solvent level up.

Engine Belts, Hoses & Coolant Check. Check belts for cracks or other indications of wear. Look for any indication of radiator fluid leaking from the system. Finally make sure your coolant is ready to handle cold weather without freezing.

Battery Care. If your battery is more than four years old, you may want to have it checked. Old batteries tend to work fine in warm weather but a cold snap can kill a poor battery.

Heater. Make sure the heater blows hot air and it is functioning properly for both heat and defrost modes.

Driving Habits. With the changing weather, your driving habits will require a change as well. Even though you have 4-wheel drive, ABS and traction control, it takes longer to stop on icy roads. Give yourself more space between you and other drivers, add a few minutes to your driving time and use common sense to remain safe.

Emergency Kit. Your emergency kit should include such items as a blanket, snacks and water.

Snow Brush. Purchase a good snow brush and make it a habit to clean your roof and back windows in addition to the windshield. Keep your wiper blades free of snow and ice.

Fuel Reserves. Keep your fuel tank above ¼ tank. Maintaining a minimum of ¼ tank of fuel helps prevent moisture from building up in the tank as the temperature changes. Maintaining an adequate amount of fuel can be a great benefit if involved in a traffic jam. Remember... It's cold out there.

Clothing. If you're involved in a wreck or have trouble with your vehicle, you may have to get out and walk. Make sure you are prepared for winter temperatures.

Finally, protect your stored cars from varmints!!!

Every spring we find mice in cars that have not been properly protected and the damage they do can be very expensive. Take the time and make the investment to protect your stored vehicle.

Michigan is often filled with beautiful scenery and great activities during the winter. Take some time to get out and enjoy the many benefits we have here in West Michigan.

The original running featured some of the sweetest rides of the era, including muscle cars, Corvettes, Jaguars, Austin-Healeys, Porsches, Maseratis and Ferraris. And it attracted colorful characters in the driver's seat, too. "One year a doctor from Chicago took a Jaguar into the bank and shortened the car by four inches (but walked away)," remembers Mike Taghon. "Another year our local priest ran a Pontiac up the hill. His time was slow, but it was entertaining to watch." Member Jerry "Bing" Kolk noted in 1975 "the event has been mostly dominated by Corvettes from the Detroit area...there were only three of four modified Vettes that had faster times than the Porsches...and, for nine (Porsche) drivers, seven of us took trophies."







The Furrin Group car club organized the hill climb at Johnson Park in Kent County from the early 1950's through the mid 1980's. Using the parks scenic drive that is so narrow and twisty that motorized traffic is no longer even permitted. "The first time I raced there, I went airborne at the finish line and took out two small trees. But missed the big one." said Rick Riley. Another one of our current members said in 1974 "the hill scares me and I really don't know if I ever want to run it. Anyone who thinks he can talk me into it is certainly welcome to – I'd just as soon run it, but...!" Apparently someone took up the challenge and whoever that was gave Craig Paull an amazing pep-talk. For Craig ran and took a 1st in class the following year.



Porsches did indeed shine at these hill climbs, in particular, at Johnson Park where fast times of the day (FTD's) were taken in 1973 by Dan Dixon in a completely stock 914 2.0 "complete with baloney skin Dunlops". Again in 1975 by Phil Cull, and twice in 1976 by Pat Lanham in the Spring event and Warren Holcomb in the Fall, all in 356 Speedsters. And to make it four years in a row, Rick Riley in 1977 in the 1975 Carrera he owns to this day.



It must be clarified that the Furrin Group's memorable FTD trophy was the largest bottle of Jim Beam available!




The classic line from *Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid* when trapped at the top of the cliff with the only escape being jumping into the raging river below, Sundance admits he can't swim. Butch replies "Are you crazy? The fall will probably kill you." Similarly, without guard rails, run off areas, or other protective barriers, about vintage hill climbs it could be said that "don't worry about going off the road and dropping into the ravine, the trees
