

# NOTHING TO DO? LET'S GET INVOLVED!

In last month's UberAlles, Glenn wrote about how to put on a "Dinner Drive". He was actually talking about two events, one being the "Driving Tour", and the second, the "Dinner". To expand on his article, I will discuss the requirements for hosting the "Dinner" part. These requirements also hold true for a stand alone "Dinner" only, too.

We've had some fantastic dinners in the past that are always well attended. If you've ever said to yourself, "I'd like to put on a dinner, I wonder how you do that"? It's actually pretty straight forward. First, chat with one of the board members or attend a board meeting with a date and place in mind. That way we can put your event on the calendar. Next, to help you decide on a location, ask the manager at the restaurant of your choice the following questions to zero in on the perfect place. Does the restaurant have adequate and safe parking, a separate section or room (the club does not cover any additional costs), how many people can the restaurant accommodate, we prefer separate checks, we may need extra servers, and are food selections limited or can we order "off the menu"?

Once you have secured the perfect location and date, you need to prepare a promo to let people know about your event. Looking at past ÜberAlles promos will help you talk up your event. After making this the event that no one would want to miss, you then send your promo off to Über, the Webmeister and Amber Door. Basically that's about it!! You could even think about an outdoor venue as we move into warmer weather, such as a park!

Please consider hosting a dinner event. There are plenty of great folks on the board who would be very willing to help you. Also, as your social chairperson, I will share with you a checklist of what to do and personally communicate with you through the process to cover any questions that you may have.

# A LOOK BACK

#### **GINGERMAN RACEWAY**

I would like to thank the following people for their contributions to this article; Jonathan Davis - Southhaven.org, Break/ Fix the Gran Touring Motorsports Podcast - Racingcircuits.info, and Richard Ranville - Amateur Road Racing in Michigan.



The success of the Gingerman Tavern gave owner Dan Schnitta greater options, freedom, and the next chapter of this story. Dan became involved in road racing back in Chicago in the company of business associates who introduced him to the Porsche club. He became a WMR member in 1985 when he owned both a 1963 blue 356 Cabriolet, and a 1978 red 928 "daily driver". He first attended sports car events, then bought a race prepared BMW 320i and finally started participating, eventually racing throughout the Midwest. Dan purchased the former Nothdruft Farms

property in the early 1990's to have a place to race the way he thought amateur racing should be done. Before long Dan's concept of what a track should be was forming, but the township where the first track was located would not cooperate with his plans for improvement and expansion. Dan looked for a new location. A prime prerequisite for the site, in a rural, sparsely populated spot, was that the township had no zoning restrictions. When he learned about a dormant apple orchard close to downtown South Haven, he recognized an opportunity to pursue his passion for racing. Schnitta bought the orchard in 1995.



Dan saw the gently rolling terrain being able to permit the subtle elevation changes, prized by road racing drivers. The land proved to have substantial deposits of sand, crucial to a properly constructed track and provided room to design a track. Grattan Raceway and Waterford Hills were both "designed" to use as much available land as there was at those sites; that is, they were drawn to fit what was available. The site for Gingerman was chosen to make available as much land as Dan Schnitta's exacting expectations would require. The 350 acres of land includes

sprawling areas of a shaded wood, plenty of paddock space and a pond fully stocked with fish. The idea, according to Schnitta, is to allow visitors to "feel the comfort of a state park". The property also benefits from a location close to other attractions; visitors are just six miles away from the beach, boutiques, events and dining at the South Haven beach-side community.

Schnitta hired an internationally known designer, Alan Wilson, of Wilson Motorsport, a Denver track design and management company to design the track. Wilson is a former car and motorcycle racer who was Director of Operations at Brands Hatch in England before coming to the USA in 1983. He has operated events for Formula One, Indy Car, Trans-Am, IMSA GTP and International motorcycles, including the famed Trans-Atlantic race series. He has designed and built street race tracks for IMSA GTP, Indy Car and Trans-Am events in Columbus, Ohio, Denver and Dallas. He is responsible for the design of the infield road coarse for the Las Vegas Speedway, a 3 mile road course development near Philadelphia and for the layout and development of the Palm Springs International Raceway. The Gingerman design provided



for future expansion. Schnitta hired an engineering firm to supervise construction, but dismissed it when he decided he and Wilson could act as general contractors, using local firms to do the work. Dan has hired local firms to do the work at Gingerman ever since. Construction began in 1995. The intention was to create a club racing-level course with clear runoffs and wide, smooth paving to avoid costly vehicle damage, especially for newer drivers. The design has won plaudits, including a Safe Track Award from the vintage and historic racing publication, Victory Lane Magazine. The facility was finished in October 1995 and opened for general testing, ahead of its first full season of racing in 1996, mainly SCCA car racing and club-level motorbike races.

The track bears the distinction of being one of the country's safest. Schnitta had the track designed to exclude hazards such as ditches, trees and utility poles. In order to be on the track, drivers must have either attended a driving school or already been on another track at least three times. "Recreational racers cannot afford to repair their cars after minor mistakes, so we have provided wide open run-off areas that are as smooth as a golf course fairway," explains Wilson. "We have also tried to build a track that will encourage close competition, so have included at least four major overtaking points. There is also a very technical section that will allow a well driven smaller car to match a more powerful vehi-

cle's overall lap times, providing for exciting racing." The open layout allows for greater safety and visibility for drivers, workers and racers, yet the subtle elevation changes and careful layout provide a racing experience far beyond a flat, sharp angled airport. The shape of the property allows a spectator area on top of a modest hill where spectators can follow an exciting duel between competing cars all the way around the track. Modern bathrooms with showers, a small convenience store, meeting room and picnic and camping grounds are all presented on a well manicured, landscaped park like setting and together offer all the amenities week end racers and spectators desire.




Two important initiatives are underway. On the southwest corner of the property map is an area marked "Endless Summer". That portion of the property will be subdivided around access roads to both the track and the road to South Haven. Negotiations are underway with a company building quality prefabricated semi-custom buildings to build combination garage — apartments. Owners will keep their racecars and boats on the site for easy access to the track and Lake Michigan. The apartments will provide weekend and vacation retreats for racers and their families. A small club house is planned for social events. Everything will be built to quality, affordable specifications. Dan mentions dismissively a similar project in Illinois where "memberships" approach one million dollars. Endless summer will be high quality, realistically priced and will not break ground until a suitable number of participants have committed. Endless summer will be expected to pay its own way.

Thus we are now up to date with latest adventures dreamed by a man inspired by The Ginger Man and the will to do something with it.

# REVIEW: MORNING AFTER BRUNCH




