

our 9th Annual Sporting Clays Shoot off at the Blendon Pines Gun Club.

Up for a little outdoor "golf with a gun"? Then plan to come out for this event. For those unfamiliar with Sporting Clays it is a form of clay pigeon shooting on a course that consists of shooting stations "holes" in natural terrain. Unlike traditional skeet shooting sporting clays simulates the unpredictability of live-quarry shooting, offering a great variety of trajectories, angles, speeds, elevations, and distances. Trust is when we say -- No skill or previous shooting experience is required to participate and have fun.

This event is outside along a groomed trail - Rain or shine. As part of the trail is in the woods even in the rain there is a lot of protection from the weather. Please wear appropriate clothing and shoes. Eye and ear protection is REQUIRED. Regular glasses/sunglasses are adequate and they do have some protective eye-wear available, but if it's busy they may run out. They also sell earplugs.

Guns are available to rent for 10.00 (2 people can share 1 gun) and of course ammunition is available for sale. The cash cost (2.00 higher for credit card use) will be 26.00, not including gun (~10.00) /ammunition (~ 10.50/ box) - 2 boxes required. You are more than welcome to bring your own shotgun and ammunition. Additionally, if you would like to participate, but are unsure about the walking distance let us know.

This February I had the wonderful opportunity to go down to Birmingham Alabama to take part in the Porsche track experience at Barber Motorsports Park. This differs from the Experience Centers in LA and Atlanta in that this is more of a track focused school rather than an experience. I was signed up for the 1 day precision class immediately followed by the 2 day masters class for 3 straight days of track fun! You start the morning with a full breakfast and a classroom session. The classroom session was only 30 minutes and covered the basics of weight transfer, racing line, and max grip potential. By 8:30 we were out in the cars for behind the wheel learning. The class was split up between the track and the "proving grounds" where you worked on handling drills. Up in the proving grounds we were further divided into 3 sections; Autocross, skid pad, and weight transfer. In

the autocross challenge we got to take the new Boxster and Cayman GTS 4.0 for a spin and push the agility in a figure 8 autocross. From the autocross we popped over to the skid pad which was an eye-opening drill. There is a 6 acre parking lot that is completely sealed and then they have sprinklers that run the entire time. The pad acts like ice and vou lose control in as little as 15 mph with a wrong turn of the wheel or application of the pedals. In this drill we focused on oversteer and understeer. The focus was on what causes each of those scenarios and how to recover. What an interesting feeling to lose control of a

car at 15 mph and just keep spinning for another 100 feet. This drill proved valuable out on the solo track sessions! After the skid pad we went over to weight transfer. This section was all about learning how to shift the weight of the car to maximize grip area and reach the full potential of the tires. We got to use launch control in the new 911 Turbo S and the Taycan Turbo S followed by threshold braking. We did some swerving drills and trail braking exercises as well. After the drills we swapped with the track group and did lead/follow sessions around the track in the 992 Carrera S. We took a break for a catered lunch and after lunch we did the same rotation of skills drills and track time. At the end of the first day the instructors took us for a "hot lap" to show us what the cars were capable of doing around the track. What a shock that was.. I couldn't believe how intense that ride was and how

calm they were behind the wheel. This whole experience is run by former Porsche race car drivers who have experience ranging from PCA spec racing clear to IMSA endurance racing. The biggest take away from the hot lap was how late they brake and how violent the braking is. After the hot laps we were able to tour the Barber Motorsports museum where they house George Barbers private collection of over 1600 motorcycles and another 100+ race cars. The 5 storied facility was packed floor to ceiling with history. I left the first day with a HUGE smile on my face and a new appreciation for how good the drivers on TV really are.

A LOT OF HOT AIR!

A lot of hot air is what can save your life in case of a frontal crash if you have one of the earlier Porsche Airbags. Actually, hot nitrogen, produced by a chemical reaction in the Airbag.

Have you ever wondered how airbags work? What if any is their maintenance? or, Have you heard that you shouldn't use a full face helmet in conjunction with an airbag? Keep on reading and we'll fill you up, I mean fill you in;)

The goal of an airbag is to slow the passenger's forward motion as evenly as possible in a fraction of a second when a crash occurs, because as we all know speed doesn't kill, it's the sudden stop that gets you.

In 1987 Porsche introduced the first automobile in the world to have as standard equipment driver and passenger airbags. That car was the 944 Turbo. The 944 and 944 S offered Airbags as optional equipment that same year.

Eleven years later, in 1998, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) mandated as standard equipment dual frontal airbags in cars and a year later in light trucks as well.

The airbag's inflation system reacts potassium nitrate (KNO3) with sodium azide (NaN3) to produce nitrogen gas which inflates the bag.

Think of the airbag inflation system as a solid rocket booster. The airbag ignites a solid propellant which burns very rapidly and creates a large volume of gas to inflate the bag. The airbag actually bursts from its storage at up to 200 mph. A second later the nitrogen gas dissipates through small holes in the bag which completely deflates it.

Today, the technology has evolved to also include side impact airbags, curtain airbags, side tubular airbag knee airbags and others to further protect the vehicle's occupants. The technology also changed so that today's airbags produce cool nitrogen, not hot gas.

From impact to full deployment, a driver's airbag takes approximately 30 - 40 milliseconds (0.030 - 0.040 second) - an eye blink takes 0.2 second - while the passenger

airbag, which is larger, takes 40-80 milliseconds to inflate.

Side impact airbags must inflate and deploy much quicker because there is no crumple zone and very little space between the passenger and the door. Side-collision detection must take place within 3 milliseconds (0.003 second) and complete deployment of the side or curtain

airbags must happen within 10 - 15 milliseconds (0.010 - 0.015 second).


These side airbags can deploy much quicker because they don't depend on a chemical reaction as with the frontal bags. They have their own highpressure gas canisters and the gas is released cold.

Porsche uses a combination of airbags in their vehicles to protect its passengers:


Aside from the frontal driver and passenger airbags, The Porsche Side Impact Protection (POSIP) system on the sport cars comprises side impact protection elements in the doors and two airbags in each side.

The airbag is made of thin nylon material which is folded into the steering wheel, the passenger dash the doors and or the seats. The sensor is what triggers the airbag to inflate. It sends the signal when there is a collision force equal to running into a cement wall at 10 -15 mph. The sensor receives the information from an accelerometer built

into a microchip.



Think of the airbag inflation system as a solid rocket booster. The airbag ignites a solid propellant which burns very rapidly and creates a large volume of gas to inflate the bag. The airbag actually bursts from its storage at up to 200 mph. A second later the nitrogen gas dissipates through small holes in the bag which completely deflates it.

Day two of the weekend was the start of the Masters course. It was a similar flow to the precision course Breakfast/classroom in the morning followed by split time the rest of the day between the track and skills drills. The skills drills were the same but with more intensity and the coaches were a little harder on what they wanted to see from you. The biggest difference between the precision class and the Masters class was the track time. The Precision class is all lead follow and while you do reach about 90% of the cars ability, you are ultimately held up by the skill of the individuals in your group. The Masters class is solo track time with individual coaching. Instead of being behind the wheel of the lead car, the coaches are positioned at each of the corners on the track taking notes. After each session they meet you back in the pits and you meet with each coach 1 on 1 for details about how you performed in each section of the track. They covered everything about your driving; speed, braking, turn in point, vision, use of the track, track out point, and exit speed. This portion was extremely educational and I really felt my driving improve with each session. At the end of the 2nd day they hosted us for dinner and social hour.


Day three was focused on maximizing everything we learned over the last 2 days. We did skills in the morning

and they had an Autocross competition to see who was the fastest! I represented WMR well with a 3rd place finish only .08 behind first place. The rest of the day was split between driving and observing. We had the chance to go sit in the corner stations and spot the same things the coaches were watching. It was a great chance to see the entry and exit and the speed differential of the drivers who were doing it right vs. the ones who weren't. The highlight of the weekend was my last track session. I got a full 30 minutes behind the wheel of the new GT3 out on the track! I still can't even put words to how it felt behind the wheel of that monster. It felt every bit of race car with the comfort of a street car. The front end is completely redesigned and the steering input is effortless! It required maybe 75% of the input that the Carrera S had and was unbelievably smooth. The braking required more effort but when you got the foot down it stopped incredibly fast. Then, there's the sound... It is LOUD! 9,000 RPMs screaming right behind your head gave you goosebumps coming out of every corner. The car wants to be driven and abused and it seemed the harder you pushed it the easier it got. I wish I was able to reach the limits of the car but my skill level is just not there yet. Even the works drivers were shocked at how close the GT3 was compared Continued on page 15

The Macan, for instance, is equipped with full-size frontal airbags just like the sports cars, but also offers driver and passenger knee airbags and the POSIP includes side airbags in the front seats, curtain airbags along the entire roof frame and the side windows from the A-pillar to the C-pillar, and side airbags for the rear compartment.

Regarding maintenance, Porsche's airbag systems are very well made and are supported by a very sophisticated self-diagnostic capability. Even the very early airbag systems will detect minute changes within the system and return an error message or warning light if specific electronic values are exceeded or operational issues are detected. If your airbag warning light lights up when you turn on the ignition and then goes off by



itself a few seconds later, your airbag system is ready to work for you.

Porsche recommends inspecting the airbag system eight years after manufacture and every two years thereafter for the life of the car. Porsche does not recommend replacing airbags at any specific time interval, only when, if ever, they are inflated.

And the one about not using a full-face helmet in conjunction with an airbag. Myth or fact? If you are using a three-point restraint (shoulder/lap seatbelt) such as on a DE or AX there is no problem in using a full face helmet.

If you are using a racing seat with a five or six point restraint harness you should not have an operational airbag.

The reason is that with a 3-point seatbelt, in a frontal crash, your torso will move forward as the belt tightens and stretches a bit, aligning your chest with the inflating airbag, as it was designed.

With a 5 or 6 point restraint your torso will not move forward appreciably, just your head. This puts your chin in line with the inflating bag which can catch the edge of the helmet's chin protection area and snap your head back!



That's why you don't find airbags in racecars.

Also remember that the airbag system is not a substitute for seatbelts.

They both



work together making your car safer for you and your passenger(s).




to the RSR and Cup cars they raced. I have a video posted on my Facebook page from one of my laps behind the wheel.

There is software built into the USB sticks that allows you to pull up your metrics against their comparison lap so you can see exactly where you can make improvements. Also, where else do you get to abuse brand new Porsche's that somebody else has to maintain!? The food was good, the facilities were excellent, and the cars were phenomenal! But at Porsche we know it's not about the cars, but the people, and the coaches were incredible!
