ENTHUSIASTS EXPLAINED

Even with all the challenges in 2021 we had 202 members participate in at least 1 of 13 events that we were able to hold. Of the 202, 37 were new members that joined the club in 2020 or 2021.

Every year WMR selects an Enthusiast of the Year and a New Member Enthusiast of the year. The Enthusiast of the Year has their name engraved on a pin that is added to the roving trophy that they get to keep for the year. The New Member Enthusiast of the year will receive a name tag that has the award engraved on it along with their name.

The selection process uses a standard point system based on attendance to WMR events and newsletter involvement.

The point system explained:

Driving your own Porsche to an event: 5

50 or more miles one way: 10

For participation in a WMR event:

For other articles/pictures: 10

Once you're selected as an Enthusiast you cannot be selected again for the following two years.

The 2021 Enthusiast of the year is Wolfgang Bubeck.

The 2021 New Member Enthusiast of the year is Ted Alberda with 75 points.

Amber was the winner last year and Jerry the year before so neither were eligible this year as a result the trophy will have to leave the Arens/Door household. The results were very close with only 10 points between Wolfgang and Chuck.



Several new members joined us for lively conversation, as did Dean Juth, owner of Timbers and a WMR member. Ted Blacklidge and Chris Ackerman welcomed attendees and I passed out flower seed packets to encourage us all to "think spring" in a month or so. Some Porsches were driven and, thankfully, the rain/snow showers held off until the luncheon was over ... cool!

CHEESBOURG IN PORSCHE DEVICE

One of the good sources I use for researching our club's history is the Kent District Library newspaper archives available online. Enter the search term "Porsche" and you'll get hundreds of hits from world and local race results to the classified ads I found for the April article. In an April 1966 sports section column "Pit Stops" by Don Thomas, he interviews Indy car driver Bill Cheesbourg. Bill was in town "working with local police and sheriff's departments representing a spark plug company's highway safety team.....talking safety to students.....and wound up the local tour at Union High". I was a sophomore there at the time and already a gear-head because I actually remember that visit. Admittedly connecting Cheesbourg to WMR probably will use all six degrees of separation, but, spoiler alert, this was also the first year a Porsche powered car would enter the Indy 500!

Bill raced in the Indianapolis 500 from 1957 thru 1965, with a best finish

of 10th place. He has been labeled everything from "hard charger", to "journeyman", and a "driver that would give anything with four wheels a try". He certainly did drive a number of the most radical entries ever to compete.



In 1958 a 15-car pileup on Lap 1 the rear sway bar on Cheesbourg's Supercharger V8 Kurtis Novi Special broke. "There wasn't a car I couldn't pass on the straightaway, But those turns hurt me. The guys I passed on the straightaways ran off and left me in the turns. I had to make almost four complete turns around the steering wheel to get around a curve." Somehow he finished 10th anyway.



John S. Zink owned the winning Offenhauser powered cars at Indy in 1955 and 1956. For 1962 Zink's "Trackburner" turbine car was tested by Cheesbourg and Dan Gurney. Powered by a Boeing 375-hp gas turbine, the car was 500 lighter than an Offie roadster. Although fast by itself, throttle lag in traffic would present insurmountable problems during a race. The car was withdrawn without a qualifying attempt being made, but Bill's practice times were 3-mph faster than Gurney's.



Hot rodding legend Mickey Thompson teamed up with British chassis designer John Crosthwaite to build three Buick-powered mid-engine fully independent-suspension cars for the 1962 race, all sponsored by Harvey Aluminum. While "rookie" Dan Gurney qualified eighth , but Bill failed to get the second team car up to qualifying speed before crashing. Bill was not hurt. Gurney managed 92 laps before the car blew an improperly installed grease seal in the transaxle and the gears locked up.




In 1966, Bill attempted to qualify Adams Aircraft Special. This was another turbine car. USAC had no restrictions on turbine engines before 1967 and in '66 Norm Demler put a GE turbine thought to have over 1000-hp into one of his chassis. Though it wasn't particularly fast for a full lap this was due to poor handling and braking. On the straights it was hitting a top speed of 260 mph. USAC excluded the car on the grounds of safety

But what is Cheesbourg's relation to Porsche?

The car that connects Bill to us and one of the weirdest is the Stein Porsche from 1966. The car had two Porsche engines. One in front, driving the front wheels, and one in back, driving the back wheels. It was build by Joe Huffaker for Al Stein, with two brand new at the time Porsche 911 engines driving through Porsche 901 transmissions at each




end. During his qualifying attempt he hit and killed a little rabbit coming out of turn 2. The rabbit was unfortunate as the car had the aero- dynamics of a brick and was hopelessly slow failing to qualify by over 20 mph. If you've been in the club for as long as me, you may still have a January 1980 Panorama with a short story about the car. And here is a link to December 2018 "Classic Porsche" for a much more detailed history of Al Stein's brainchild. And another with more photos from Flatsixes.com. 


