

A LOOK BACK - THE EARL OF WMR

I could write an entire article about just how this very debonair fellow from the 1950's is attired. From his beret, Ray Ban eyeglass frames, ascot scarf, cardigan sweater, pocket watch with chain, cuffed trousers, and could those possibly be vintage "Hush Puppies"! And, of course, enjoying a cigarette while his loving wife refills his Chardonnay. And, yes, that is a PCA pin on her lapel!

This is Earl Kirschbaum and his wife Mary photographed by John Alexander in 1957. At the time Earl and Mary lived in Alma, Michigan and were visiting their friends, John and his wife Ruth at their cottage on Lake Mecosta. The cool red 1955 Cabriolet of Earl's apparently made quite the impression on John. Along with the Kirschbaum's, the Alexander's attended the very first "Treffen" to Germany in 1958 to pick up their own Porsche! More about that first Treffen in the upcoming months, and many thanks to John's grandson, Ed Salo for sharing these photos and so much more.

Current national PCA historian, Linda Goodman, sent us this article about Earl from a 1959 Panorama:

"Born 1906—Detroit, Michigan. The fascination of the gas buggies was deeply instilled in Earl Kirschbaum at an early age. His desire and dream to own his own car came true with the purchase of a Model T, which promptly was "souped up."

After several years of burning up gas and tires, Earl turned to the serious side of life and enrolled in the School of Dentistry at the University of Michigan. In 1933, after graduation, he married the one and only Mary. Due to outdoor interest and the desire to raise their three boys close to nature and in a small town, the family located in Alma, Michigan.

The early passion for unique cars, which lay dormant while bringing up the family, was revived by the purchase of a 1500 Porsche Convertible in 1955. Several months later Earl became a charter member of PCA and attended the first Parade. From here on in, it was Porsches and PCA.

His love for the feel of the wheel and the drifting of corners again came into being having attended a drivers' school to secure a competition license in 1958—running a few minor races, then laying up the helmet with the realization that age was becoming a factor.

He is now "Porschering" in his third Convertible, having driven over seventy-five thousand miles since 1956, traveling through most of the states, Mexico and on the continent with the first PCA Tour.

Earl was appointed the Regional Director of Michigan at the first Parade and helped to organize the present Southeastern Michigan Region. He was later elected First Vice President of the National Organization and then to his present post as President of PCA.

Porsches and PCA have become a way of life for the Earl Kirschbaums. All of PCA land salute you."

Earl and Mary were at the very first meeting of what was to become the West Michigan Region at the Greenridge Country Club in Grand Rapids in 1960. As President of PCA at the time, the "Charter to PCA, Western Michigan Region" is signed by Earl Kirschbaum.

SEVEN RANDOM TIPS YOU CAN USE ON ANY CAR — INCLUDING YOUR PORSCHE

Here's a collection of seven, random tech tips, whether you're a Porsche owner or not.

- 1. When jumpstarting a car equipped with AutoStart, remember to disable that feature after you've started the vehicle. Otherwise, the first traffic light you encounter with a red light, will cause the vehicle to shut off and odds are that the battery is not fully charged to restart the engine again.
- 2. When checking your brake pads, remember to check the inside and outer pads. While they normally wear evenly, sometimes they do not. It's better to find out earlier that you may need a new caliper rather than destroying a brake disc and caliper at the same time.



3. If you've just purchased your first vintage air-cooled 911, you will check the oil only once the car has reached operating temperature. Air-cooled 911s use a dry sump oil lubrication which means they have a separate oil tank. On a cold engine, simply checking the dipstick will show that car is very low on oil when in reality it is not. This leads to people unnecessarily adding oil and then possibly damaging the engine.



4. Only check your car's tire pressures when the tires are cold. This usually means early in the morning or after the sun has set. A tire that's facing the sun will show higher pressures than the other side of the car whose tires are in the shade. Never check them after a drive unless you are specifically looking to check "hot" pressures (such as for the track or autocross).



- 5. Don't forget to maintain your car's weatherstripping. A silicone-based conditioner will keep the seals pliable, clean, and healthy looking. If you live in an area where it freezes during winter months, the conditioner will also prevent the door from freezing shut. Try and condition it every six months.
- 6. When inspecting your tires, get down on your knees and check the inside rear tire tread. Many times people will look at the visible outside tread and not realize that most of the wear on rear Porsche tires are on the inside. Checking the inside front is easier as all you have to do is move the steering all the way to one side.



7. If you get a small chip or star crack on your windshield, go to a windshield repair shop and see if they can fix it. Sometimes, it's covered under insurance. If you let it go for a while, it will start to crack further and necessitate a replacement windshield. As we learned in a previous Tech Tactics Live, getting your insurance company to use an authentic, factory replacement windshield is not always guaranteed. Check out this video to learn more about replacing windshields.

If you're following the Porsche Formula 1 rumors over the last year, you're likely up-to-date that both Porsche and Red Bull have publicly announced that there will be no F1 partnership of the two brands. Although it saddens me to read the news, I'm not a huge Red Bull fan. I do believe the two would have been a superteam and would have competed quite well against the likes of Mercedes and Ferrari for many F1 titles for years to come. And I would really like to see Porsche back in Formula 1. But alas, irreconcilable differences broke up these possibilities. With a looming October 15 Formula 1 deadline to announce F1 engine manufacturer status, Porsche is up against the clock. Porsche has commented, "With the finalized rule changes, the racing series nevertheless remains an attractive environment for Porsche, which will continue to be monitored." So maybe there is still a chance? How could that come about? I really doubt that the F1 teams would allow another entry, whether it's Porsche directly or a Porsche/Andretti matchup that has been mentioned recently. The other F1 teams are too greedy to give up a possible percentage of the prize money. The only option I see as a possibility is with McLaren. Probably a long-shot, but I'd love to see Porsche and McLaren join forces again and again beat Ferrari like the pair did in mid-1980s. The combo won three World Championships and 25 Grand Prix victories between 1983 and 1987. Could this winning duo be brought back starting in 2026? Andreas Seidl, McLaren's F1 team principal ran the 919 squad during Porsche's three WEC championship victories. So, maybe a Porsche/McLaren matchup could be in private discussions right now. I sure hope so.
